Background



...a system that limits the ability to obtain comparable data in early years.





Widely used assessments in Kindergarten have different cut scores for determining kindergarten readiness, making comparison difficult



Kindergarten Cut Scores

TEA Example: One Student, Multiple Assessments

The same student may be evaluated differently on each instrument, making the data confusing for the teacher and student.

The 5 to 7-minute screener:

- Designates a student Kindergarten Ready (KR) or Not Kindergarten Ready (NKR)
- Generates a written report to send to parents
- Provides interventions for students based on data





TX-KEA Screener has been designated as the multidimensional tool to be administered to Kindergarten students in the Fall of 2020.



A screener will help inform instruction for every student. The data will be shared with families and they can partner with the schools to close any gaps the student may have.



Effective K-2 diagnostics are a crucial support for other reading initiatives within HB3.

Must administered to each student 1:1 by teacher; Some subtests need computer and headphones

Note. If the student's response contains the target word, you can score his/her response as correct. For example, the item shows a picture of a vacuum and the correct response is "vacuum". The student says, "vacuum cleaner" for this item. This response is scored as correct because the student's response contains the target word 'vacuum".

Additional Prompts

- If student responds in the wrong language:
- "What's the English word?"
- If student labels the wrong part of a picture:
- "What is this (point)?"
- If student's response reflects a higher level of categorization (e.g., student responds "animal" for dog)
- "What kind?"
- If student's response reflects a lower level of categorization (e.g., student responds "golden retriever" for dog)
- "Tell me another word."

Teacher-Recorded Letter Knowledge **English** Vocabulary English/Spanish

Must be administered to each student 1:1 by teacher

Scoring Instructions





- Use touchscreen computer/laptop
- Teacher sits close by to monitor and prompt, if necessary
- Have headphones available and make sure volume is turned up.
- Student listens to directions and self selects
- If touchscreen not available, the teacher moves mouse to select **first** student answer.



TEA Pilot TX-KEA Literacy Screener: Response Types





	Kindergarten Entry Assessment
	Teacher Script for Spelling Subtest - English
HAT	s. Say: "It is your turn to spell some words. I am going to say a word and show you a picture of the word. Then you will write the word on the line." [point to the first image aline. Pass out student forms.] Say: Put your finger on the picture of the HAT. [Point to the line for the word "hat".] Say: The word is <u>HAT</u> . Do the best you can to write the sounds you hear in <u>HAT</u> ."
	 If a student does not understand or says "I don't know," say: That's okay. Just write what you can and put the pencil down when you're done." If a student is scribbling but staying within the line, then allow them to "scribble/inte" for 5 yoo seconds then say: Okay that's all the time we have for that word so put your pencil down. If a student understands to write on the line, you do not need to remind them to write on the line after time, but if they are writing outside of the line repeat: Remember to write on the line. If the student seems to be finished spelling the word or have paused for several seconds, then prompt Xre you done with that word? Allow student to respond. If they say no, then allow up to 15 seconds before you stop them: Let's go on to the next word.

Scoring the Spelling

Scoring Guidelines for TX-KEA Spelling Subtest

Students are scored as follows:

- 1. <u>HAT</u>: Mark all of the letters which were written for the word HAT. Mark all that apply.
 - a. 1 point The first letter of the word is a recognizable H/h or reversal.
 - b. 1 point The second letter of the word is a recognizable A/a or reversal.
 - c. 1 point The third letter of the word is a recognizable T/t or reversal.
 - d. O points No acceptable letters written in correct order.
- 2. <u>POT</u>: Mark all of the letters which were written for the word POT. Mark all that apply.
 - a. 1 point The first letter of the word is a recognizable P/p or reversal.
 - b. 1 point The second letter of the word is a recognizable O/o.
 - c. 1 point The third letter of the word is a recognizable T/t or reversal.
 - d. 0 points No acceptable letters written in correct order.

TEAR Administering the Pilot TX-KEA Literacy Screener

- Open the TX-KEA Literacy Pilot Screener on the dashboard
- Administer the online screener (Vocabulary and Letter Knowledge) 1:1 to 5 students
 - Spanish Letter Knowledge subtest students need headphones. The response is student selected
- Administer the Emergent Writing (spelling) to 3-5 students in a small group
 - Teachers can determine the order of administration and have the option of completing Spelling Subtest and then administering online subtests.
- Score the Spelling portion
- Enter the Spelling scores into the Pilot Screener
- Complete the survey to give your input
 - CLI Engage will send you a survey to complete after you administer the Pilot
